LOCAL UNION #432 MEETING PROCEDURES

President opens the meeting, roll call of officers, recite the Pledge of Allegiance.

COMMUNICATIONS:

These can be from the International, Regional Council, the training center, or anyone that wants to communicate to the local. All communications are read to the local and appropriate action is voted on by the membership.

BILLS:

The Treasurer reports on the local's monthly expenditures and the local votes on the paying of the bills.

REPORTS OF ACCIDENTS, SICKNESS OR DEATH, COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Reports of Committees formed for different objectives made up of volunteers from the membership.

Reports of Delegates from the Local on Quarterly Regional Council Meeting. Each Local is entitled to a certain number of delegates to the Regional Council based on total number of membership. Delegates are regular members who are elected by the local's membership.

GOOD OF THE ORDER:

This is an open floor where any questions or comments can be made by the membership. To address the floor, raise your hand. When called on by the President, stand up and state your name and proceed with your question or comment.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

This is where ideas in the "form of a motion" where expressed earlier in the meeting and either tabled or put in the hands of the appropriate committee and now need to be voted on by the membership.

NEW BUSINESS:

This is where ideas in the "form of a motion" are expressed and voted on as to how to deal with the business at hand.

Pending no new business, the meeting is adjourned.






Apple Store for iOS Devices:
